These nets were given to children who were brought to the centres with nutrition problems The mothers received the mosquito nets on behalf of their children who signed the distribution lists prepared by concern Concern nutrition teams informed the beneficiaries during their visitations to the facilities

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Partner Organizations: UNHCR and CONCERN WORLDWIDE were the only partners who made decisions regarding this distribution UNHCR provided the mosquito nets and CONCERN WORLDWIDE distributed in its centres on daily basis following the prepared list of the beneficiaries 					
Changes from assessment recommendations

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> There were not changes since all the targeted households had their children enrolled into the nutrition program, that was the criteria chosen by the partners in the beginning 					
Targeting criteria					
<p>- Who finally received and why? Did the group to be targeted change in any way between the initial assessment and those who received on distribution day?</p>					
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> There were many cases of malaria reported by the health partners in the POCs and that prompted the 					

protection partners to ask concern and UNCHR to response.

- It was then decided that the mosquito needs be distributed through the nutrition programs since the malaria prevalence is common among children under five years

Challenges and lessons learned

-Did you face any major challenges, and/or learn any useful lessons?

- It was realised that one mosquito net was not enough per household. Some families have more than five children who need at least two nets
- Children who were not brought to the nutrition centres were not targeted and so the coverage is not big

Recommended next steps

-Should any further action be taken in the area by the Shelter and NFI Cluster, or other actors?

- I recommend distribution of mosquito nets annually to prevent the children and these mothers from malaria that takes a lot of money and time especially the school going children.
- It should be done to all residents of POCs and awareness to be given to them, there is a general feeling that people know the importance of mosquito nets which is not the case.
