Humanitarian Situation in this Area			



The overall humanitarian situation in Leah payam, Mayendit county remains unstable as shown by restarting of violence or tension in Unity state which has hindered delivery of life saving assistance to the most affected population. This restarting of violence or tension has resulted into displacements of people from neighboring areas to Leah payam, because it is considered to be safe place and far from the areas where fighting is escalating, even of the humanitarian situation is not stable in Leah. These displaced people are in need of humanitarian assistance.

ICRM composed by six Humanitarian Clusters lead by OCHA went to Mayendit - Leah payam, in response to famine affected families, on 22nd April 2017. S-NFI team worked in coordination with Nutrition team to identify the households with malnourish cases. Though the team was expecting to receive high cases of MAM and SAM, only 21 SAM cases were found as result on the first day. Having this information in hands, the team changes the methodology to include the Elderly Women and PLW on the targeted criteria.

In conclusion of the response, out of 1000 HHs served with survival kits, only 251 are households with SAM and MAM case. The rest are PLW and Elderly women.

S/NFI Needs and Support Provided

Shelter and NFI team managed to distribute 1000 Survival kits to 1000 families of MAM, SAM Elderly women and PLW.

Challenges

The population was more than expected in Leah Payam. Though 1000 survival kits were distributed to 1000 HHs, the team can still see more PLW and Elderly women, plus the new arrived IDPs.

Lesson Learned

Prioritizing households with SAM and MAM cases was very difficult as the entire women in the community are vulnerable and were opposed to the criteria even after explaining to the beneficiaries.
