**Summary of Distribution**

- Where was the distribution held and how was it organised?
- What and how were beneficiaries informed?
- How was equal access ensured for men, women, girls and boys?
- How was order maintained during the distribution?

The distribution took place along with the GFD by WHH. Mass community sensitization was done prior to the distribution through community leaders, camp management agency, Internews, using megaphones, etc. GFD points at each sector were used as the distribution point. The distribution points were well organized with enough UNPOL staffs and community volunteers; crowd controllers, distribution assistants, etc. Beneficiaries were requested to queue to receive the GFD first. After they received GFD, the queue continued to receive NFIs. There were three points for the verification of the IDPs to ensure that beneficiaries receive NFIs without any duplication. The first point was queuing point where the IDPs were requested to organize among themselves with their registration cards so that HHs totalling 20 individuals will receive their food ration and NFIs together. This is to avoid congestion at distribution point and also to ease food distribution activities. In the second point, the cards and tokens were double



checked to avoid any forgery. At the end, the beneficiaries handed over the tokens to the distribution assistant and received NFIs according to the number of HHs.

The distribution points are well prepared, as they are the regular GFD points. The GFD and Concern shelter team ensured equal access for men, women, girls, boys and PSNs through different queues. PSNs got support from Protection partners their community volunteers, neighbours and/or relatives to transport items using wheelbarrows.

#### **What actors were involved in the decision-making regarding the distribution process?**

After Concern conducted the assessment, the beneficiary selection criteria was discussed with the Shelter-NFI Cluster. Once, it was agreed with the cluster to do blanket distribution, the distribution methodologies were discussed at different level and with actors; such as:

- Discussion within Concern.
- Discussion with WHH (the GFD actor) at Bentiu.
- Discussion with IOM Camp Management team at Bentiu.
- Discussion with community leaders.
- Discussion at Bentiu ICWG.

#### **Changes from assessment recommendations**

*-If there were any changes to the original plan, please explain what changes occurred and why they were necessary.*

Initially Concern planned to distribute 21,837 kits in total. But at the end 40,968 kits were distributed in two phases. At the beginning Concern planned to distribute according to the population count shared recently by camp management team. The population count indicated 21,837 HHs living in the PoC. But later it was realized that there is no tracking system of the HHs living in the PoC and the GFD is taking place based on the biometric registration. Hence, Concern shifted their planning to distribute according to biometric registration; 40,968 HHs.

#### **Targeting criteria**

*-Who finally received and why? Did the group to be targeted change in any way between the initial assessment and those who received on distribution day?*

Blanket NFIs distribution took place, as recommended in the assessment. The assessment indicated needs of the mentioned NFIs is high; such as

- 59% population need cooking utensils to be self-sufficient to cook food with their own cooking pots.
- 84% population need kanga.
- 82% population need sleeping mats to be distributed immediately.
- 66% population need blankets to be distributed immediately.

As the need and the caseload is too high, it was practically impossible to do target distribution. Hence, the cluster agreed with the proposition to do blanket distribution. Each registered HH received one NFI kits as mentioned above.

#### **Challenges and lessons learned**

*-Did you face any major challenges, and/or learn any useful lessons?*

Lack of proper anticipation of the number of kits to be distributed caused major challenges:

- The distribution was stopped for due to shortage of items at Bentiu. The distribution resumed after almost 45 days.
- Due to shortage, kanga were distributed to 26,940 HHs only from sector 4 and 5. Remaining 14,028 HHs received same kits except Kanga.

#### **Recommended next steps**

- PDM to be conducted in July by Concern.
- NFIs strategy for the Bentiu PoC should be developed as a longer term strategy.
